

OUR MISSION

To raise awareness of and improve mental health in the roaring fork valley by creating sustainable financial resources, by uniting professionals and agencies in mental health, and by supporting and implementing empirically based and results-oriented education and action.

OUR PHILOSOPHY

Each Aspen tree within a colony is connected by a single root pattern that thrives beneath the surface of the soil. Aspen Strong aims at creating a community that cultivates interdependence and strength, replicating its very own, the Aspen tree.

Suicide is the 7th leading cause of death. #10 nationally for deaths by suicide. #2 for ages 15-44 #4 for ages 45-54 #6 for ages 55-64

BUILDING EMOTIONAL LITERACY & CONNECTING OUR COMMUNITY

Strengthening our communities wellbeing by instilling an importance of mental hyginene is how Aspen Strong hopes to combat addiction, crisis and, the ever challenging suicide rates in our valley.

Aspenstrong.org is our primary vehicle for connecting our community to resources and for building emotional literacy among our residents . In 2018, our website had over 8,160 visitors accessing support for their mental health.

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
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MENTAL HEALTH SCREENING INITIATIVE

Since 2014, Aspen Strong has provided CHECK-UPS FROM THE NECK UP helping our community to recognize signs and symptoms of mental illness within our self or others in our community, employment, or family.

962 Mental Health Screenings (3,395 since 2014)



Over 80% of screeners said they have thought about or contemplated suicide. 55% PLAN TO SEEK HELP

Find us online, at local events, and many health fairs spreading awareness and supporting our community in building emotional literacy. With the support of over 63 volunteers, Aspen Strong attended 27 in-person awareness events in 2018.



PROVIDER DIRECTORY

Aspen Strong's recognizes much of our value in our ability to **CONNECT** the resources as to support our government in identifying gaps in the spectrum of services, yet also act as a referral agency for you, or for businesses and professionals looking to support their clients and staff. Since 2014, we have sought out to do just that by creating an online, anonymous, and searchable directory. Currently our provider directory includes **85 mental health providers and 23 organization**




includes 85 mental health providers and 23 organizations. In 2018, our site had visits from approximately 112 users each month.

WORKPLACE PARTNERSHIPS

Partnerships empower employers to deliver mental health programs and equip their employees with tools to address their mental health needs that increase the bottom line and ultimately strengthen their organization; and OUR community! In 2018, Aspen Strong led 12 'Mental Hygiene in the Workplace' workshops.

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CONNECTION CAMPAIGN



2018 brought the launch of the Connection Campaign, a valley wide promotional campaign in collaboration with Pitkin County Health and Human Services and the Aspen Community Foundation, focused on sharing a unified message to support prevention and access to resources.

Our campaign efforts inspired development of our online resources spreading a message that aspenstrong.org is a safe, anonymous, and confidential place to **Connect to People** and **Connect to Resources**. Resources now include toolkits for youth, the general public, and workplaces providing tips and tools to boost your **Emotional IQ**.

SYMPOSIUM

Our 4th annual symposium included an evening event branching out to our larger community to spearhead our **CONNECTION CAMPAIGN**. Our hope was to connect more people to resources, provide language to boost their emotional literacy, and to share a message that **NO ONE IS ALONE and WE ARE ALL ASPENSTRONG** - signifying the roots of the Aspen trees. Our symposium speakers and several leaders in our community shared in a thought provoking panel discussion as to inspire a unified message that strong minds build strong connections and strong communities.

5TH ANNUAL HIKE HOPE HEAL

This community hike helps bring continued awareness to mental health needs in our valley while connecting community members of all ages to open the dialog around mental health. Since 2014, 271 hikers have helped raise \$89,224.47 to support both Aspen Strong initiatives and the Mental Health Fund.

CHANGING BRAINS CHANGING LIVES

This annual symposium has provided brain education and strategies to support & enhance our community's emotional literacy. Our 2018 Workshop included over **100 attendees** featuring world renowed speakers, Tina Payne Bryson & Chris Willard. Sponsorships provided over **50 scholarships** to valley-wide teachers, clinicians, and professionals in the valley.





\$221.902 was earned in 2018. 16.92% were GENERAL **DONATIONS** of as little as \$5


Hike income supported 40% to the Mental Health Fund and 60% to Aspen Strong operations.
